Annual Report - 2010

Introduction:

We never thinking this planet can be fragments by the narrow feelings of communalism or political conflicts. We live in one of the poorest country in south Asia where a limited scope of access our basic needs. We have to face various critical problems due to geographical point of view and over populated situation in the country where poverty is perpetual. In the context of the Aloshikha RSD Center has taken meticulous development initiatives to address the plight and problems of vulnerable poor community in the southern part of Bangladesh and covering the three districts. The Aloshikha RSD Center Bangladesh is a well reputed social development NGO working to empower the rural poor in the southern part of Bangladesh since 25 years. The Aloshikha come into being after liberation war of Bangladesh. In 1984 a social development program was launched to assist the poorest in community development mainly to improving health and sanitation, child education and women economic activities. During the year the Aloshikha was the leading non-government agency in the southern part of Bangladesh. It is also created with introducing many major innovations like deep tube well installation and latrine production and distribution was remarkable services among the poor community and promoting child education are most famous innovation. By the late 1995 an integrated comprehensive program superseded its sect oral work, focused on concentrated group organization of the poor, emphasizing social, education and economic elements. Since the Aloshikha successes have included the community based health and sanitation program to improving life on the out reach and remote villages are raising awareness of women rights and women empowerment, promoting savings, credit and skill training to improve the livelihoods of the poor section of the community. The Aloshikha program continues to evolve and innovate; current realities mean the program now comprises a range of various projects and financing large and small, which all contribute to a common objective. However, we are always encouraging to the local communities to developing all form of education in general or vocational education that could be make them smart and expertise to engaged any job or self supportive or self-employments.

This report is a testimony to the fact that with a synergetic approach towards development with support from the donor community and the local people a lot can be done to improve livelihoods.

Aloshikha Mission statement:

Aloshikha is a Bangladeshi non-profitable humanitarian non-government organization supporting the holistic development of poor and landless people in the rural marshlands between Gopalgonj, Madaripur and Barisal.

Aloshikha will support the development in the following ways:

- O To create awareness on the importance of child and blow education among local people.
- To create awareness on health, sanitation, women development issues and community problems among local people and to encourage them to change the present situation.
- O To organize targeted poor people in small groups and make them skilled through education, training's workshops and meetings etc.
- To encourage and motivate poor people to take steps to reduce their problems, improve their health conditions and their income.
- To encourage and support the poor people to start their own activities in order to create their own income, so that they will become self- sustained.
- To provide among children and their development through nutrition coverage, child health education, nutritious food, creativity materials etc.
- To provide the safe water supply for hygienic health through the DTWs and distribution sanitary latrine to the community people as sanitation coverage.
- To encourage and convinced to the community people to provide renewable energy as solar system technology for alternative electricity.
- O To create employment opportunity and job replacement among the local unemployed youth both the girls and boys and to export skill work force to the international labor market a vocational training center has launched in the Aloshikha complex.

The hospital is situated within the Aloshikha complex and geographically it is very important because of around the 10 kilometers there is neither government hospital nor even any private clinic, where rural people can be accessing and met-up their emergency medial services. However, we are really grateful to Mr. Har Beurskins the Chairman of Aloshikha Foundation the Netherlands as to his generous donation of 4 special bed and another 10 general beds to this clinic very recently. We hope that it could be able to create more convenience and to be ensuring medial services among the rural poor people.

It was in 20 August 2010 the Aloshikha RSD Center have an brilliant opportunity to organize one International training program on Bio-Sand Filter making technology in collaboration with CAWST Canada. The main theme of the training was focused on safe drinking water access and arsenic contaminated filthy water how to be turn into safe water through Bio- Sand Filter use and its dynamic making technology at a low cost. The training was conducted and facilitated by the one of renowned overseas trainer Milinda Foram who engaged herself as an expertise on bio-sand filter technologist. More over 20 Directors of various NGOs from different places were attended on the training, as participators and duration of training program were 20 August to 27 August 2010.A much valued International Certificates have been provided every participators after long run of 7 days training courses.

It was our proud that we have an opportunity to checks our 1100 pre-school children by the MCC team like very year. The team provided free medicine together with necessary medical test as to they to need. The main objectives of the program are to reducing and combating child mortality and child morbidity rate in the area.

The Aloshikha RSD Center is a nonprofit charity organization whose aim is to conserve the country's biological diversity. Over the years Bangladesh has lost both land and water ecosystems along with the different forms of they contain.

We are now at a point where many species of plants and animals are on the verge. It is the appropriate time for urgent need of saving the biodiversity. In this point of view the organization has started the Spotted Deer and indigenous tortoise conservation program that was a very small scale and research based pilot program. Actually Deer are a unique group of mammals recognized for their grace of beauty. They are mostly the inhabitants of forest and grassland. The rapid development of firearms, trapping and netting, Deer everywhere become more vulnerable. Bangladesh Sundarbans also is a nice habitat of the Spotted Deer and as well as Barking Deer. The main prey species of Bengal tiger in the Spotted Deer, and it has caused grave concern among the nature conservationists and wildlife conservationist.

The cultural show is one of the important alternative media for raise awareness on health hygiene sanitation, safe water use, arsenic and HIV/ AIDS etc. Aloshikha organized a number of rally and seminar to observe various special days. Poster, festoon, banner, cartoon etc. containing important messages were printed and displayed in the working areas to draw attention of the community people on the central theme of the special day

The organization almost always gives more emphasized to women empowerment and to ensured women rights and to raised mass awareness on combating women trafficking and women violence among the community people in the area. National and International day observation are crucial and integral of the organization. In the light of, we celebrated the World Women Days 8th March 2010 along with poster, banner, leaflet and a colorful rally was organized and moved away the rally in main road and important places of Agailjhara Upazila.







VHC Leaser training

In our on-going project, a total of 180 VHCs have been formed newly in 1st year, whereby the total VHC have been reached to 360. The purposes of forming a VHC are to assist community to assess health, hygiene and sanitation status and safe water use in their respective villages; disseminate health related information; and help Community Health Facilitators (CHFs) of Aloshikha in organizing courtyard meetings. With support from VHCs, Aloshikha has been organizing health education sessions in each working village.



Staff development Training

Aloshikha arranged training for its staffs on water, sanitation and hygiene practice in its office premises by an expert trainer. A total of 26 staffs participated in this training. The training was for 7 days. Pre-test and post-test sessions were arranged among the trainees. The average marks obtained in pre-test was 40% while it was 90% in posttest session. The result indicates that this training helps the trainees to gather and increase knowledge on sanitation and hygiene water, practice. This training will help the

A total of 20 batches of HIV& AIDS orientation organized from the project running the working period that including 1st year, a total of 10 batches of orientation completed so far from the project whereby a total of 400 people were informed the basic information on HIV AIDS. People from different groups including male and female, community leaders, school teachers, religious leaders, social workers, cultural workers, etc. were participated in the orientation on HIV &AIDS. It had one-day orientation course by the FC

Adolescent workshop

To aware adolescent girls about reproductive health, reproductive health education sessions will be arranged among adolescent girls by forming adolescent groups in intervention areas. An adolescent group is consisted of 15 adolescent girls. Paramedics Volunteer recruited for satellite clinics conducts education sessions among adolescent groups. Community Health Facilitators also assist them to conduct these sessions. One Paramedics Volunteer conducts 2 sessions in every day and works on it for 5 days along with 1 day work in satellite clinic in every week. As a result one Paramedic conducts 40 sessions with 40 adolescent groups in every month.

A total of 220 adolescent groups are formed in working areas by 12 Paramedics Volunteers where a total of 3300 adolescent girls are enrolled in education sessions during the reporting period. There is a target to arrange 2640 education sessions with adolescent girls which are achieved properly during this reporting period

Exploring and achieving the sustainable development and need to be organizational development a capacity building and financial management training was organized in the last week of September 2010. The training were conducted and facilitated by the external resource person as Mr. Amar Baddya who have a bright educational background on development work experience in the renowned National and International renowned development agencies. All key staff of management level of the organization was participated in the training.

A list of existing and potential local level latrine producers was prepared. At the initial stage, 7 private latrine producers were trained on low cost latrine production. Each producer was provided 1,300/- taka for their smooth production. As a result a total of 9,100/-taka were provided to 7 latrine producers



Community leader training sanitation (CLTS)

Sanitation is one of the broader activities of this project. To ensure sanitation for all, Community Led Total Sanitation (CLTS) approach- which means make a movement involving all to ensure house (HH) hold level and environmental sanitation is followed. For this purpose, it is planned to create awareness and social actions, in one hand, to promote sanitary latrine use at HH level; on the other hand contributory community latrines will be constructed to protect environmental sanitation in the target areas. Following activities are

- Produce low cost latrine and demonstrate models
- Train local level latrine producer and provide credit support
- Build and strengthen the capacity of local level government and other committees related to water and sanitation
- Observe national and international events

Satellite clinics organized in 12 different spots in the PRIMA building; and the clinics were held once in a week in the PRIMA buildings on a rotating basis. The clinic remained open for 4 hours in each working day.

Satellite Clinic: The Satellite Clinic program is most important that is deeply involved with primary health care development among the vulnerable community people. The program is paying attention on to reducing child mortality and child morbidity rate in the area. In addition to take responsibility to checking pregnant mother health care and to ensure safe delivery of new borne babies and its care and nursing including all sorts of preventive measure as to need. The satellite clinics were held once in a week in the Prima building at last 12 different spots on a rotating basis through out the month accordingly.

A Case Study of Gain family hygienic food cooking



I am Shikha Gain and my age is only 35 years. My husbands name is Birendra Nath Gain and he is 45 years old. We are living at Rajiher village, Agailjhara Upazila under Barisal District Bangladesh. We have two daughters and two sons. My daughter has been married and sons are still studied education in school levels. However, I am surely one of household wife and happy with my limited worldly goods and surroundings. One day Mrs Irin Dena who is one of the development worker and health facilitator from Aloshikha RSD

Center came to my home and request me to join a Vorer Alo mother club that was newly formed in our area. Eventually I was joining in the mother club and come to know that one meeting will be held in a month as selected day. However one of the meetings the health facilitator was amply explains and depicted that the technology of hygienic kitchen room maintenance and its sanitation management system. I was amazed and surprised to know that extreme smoke is very harmful that comes out from the cocking period that was very common in rural kitchen by using wet firewood. Before joining the club I was not much enough awarded how to making hygienic kitchen room what way the smoke would be expelled what way I could be maintain sanitation and cleanliness in kitchen room. Before that I don't know about how to be prepared hygienic food and its preservation system etc. Now I better informed and much awarded on the issue. I went to the club regularly in selecting day. Just I am trying to ventilate this key massage to our relatives and neighbors to follow on the issue in their daily life. In a word I was very grateful to health facilitator of Aloshikha RSD Center to her presented such meticulous initiatives that would be inspired me to change my daily life in better way.

For the project deep tube-wells (DTWs) have been installed in the different areas under three districts of Aloshikha. It cost Tk.38,000 to install each DTW of which community people share was Tk.6,000. A local contractor who nominated by Aloshikha and installation the DTWs with active participation of the community people.

B. Computer Training Program

Computer Training:

Mr. Har Beurskens Chairman of Aloshikha Foundation the Netherlands was denoted 13 reconditioned computers to the Aloshikha RSD center Bangladesh with a view to skill training in computer for unemployed youth (both the girls and boys) in target area and for job creation. In the light of the Aloshikha has been provided skill training in computer course on two Computer Operator Mr. Idrish khan and next Mr. Samson from Techno Touch System Ltd. Dhaka. Presently the Aloshikha has been completed 10 batches including 32 participants with skill in computer training -2010.

The Aloshikha RSD Centre Bangladesh has started its journey on Development Training Credit Union Program Practically in 2007 under three districts which is located in south west part of Bangladesh. As a member-owned, not for profit financial cooperative, Development Training Credit Union Program is committed to our members. We will uphold our fundamental responsibility to actively serve our people within our field of membership, and as appropriate, the communities they live in. We will treat all members with respect and dignity. The Aloshikha has been organized seven credit union program in their respective areas. The chief accountant of Aloshikha was conducted monthly meetings. One credit union consists of 500 members as an average size. It was duly supported by the Aloshikha Foundation the Netherlands as a pilot and demonstrative program.



C. Integrated Rural Health Support Programme

D. Education program:



Maria Child Care Biddanikaton (Rajihar).

In 2010 Maria child Care Biddanikaton had an opportunity to receive 108 numbers of students and still trying to provide them as quality education and included creativity activities on regular basis. A parents meeting was held on school premises yearly 3 times with a view to quality education. In Bangladesh all the Kindergarten schools are mainly academic oriented and we put little emphasis on extra curricular activities towards the students.

Satla is a too remote village, which is located under Wazirpur Upazila in the district of Barisal. The area is identified as a densely populated and flood porn area and found literacy rate is very below and major portion people are living there under poverty level.

The child education facilities being always over neglected there due to lack of local initiatives and lack of standard child education Institutions. In the light of the organization has build up one Kindergarten school in the area in collaboration with local elites persons actually who were interested in education and it established in 2008. However. Eventually the school is gradually developed and presently running with 167 students both the girls and boys usually they taught by the 7 efficient teachers accordingly.

The Goila kindergarten School is newly established in 2010 and running with 153 students both the girls and boys along with 7 experienced teacher. We hope that the overall teaching technique and educational environment may develop in a year.



E. Pre-school program.

Aloshikha is continuing 40 pre-schools since long and number of the students 1200. In our 40 pre-schools about 1200 students are getting quality of education by our competent teachers as well as free medical check-up, quality sanitation and hygiene facilities and nutritious feeding facilities. Our pre-school program is being continued supported by SK Foundation (the Netherlands). Aloshikha also offers a feeding programme for children where they are feeding milk and eggs four times in a week for ensure the nutrition deficiency.

F. Micro-credit program

The Micro-credit program is growing annually. Aloshikha working area are the remote villages in Agailjhara, Wazirpur, Kalkini, Kotalipara, Rajoyer and sadar Gopalgonj. In this low land area Aloshikha is reaching the poor communities and families. However Aloshikha could not fulfill all the demands of the beneficiaries.

The training program for beneficiaries and supervising, office staff and management will be continued in 2010.



The integrated approach of Aloshikha makes it possible to give a broad support to micro-credit beneficiaries. Not only practical training on small business activities, technical training and support are given by Aloshikha, but also preventive, primary and curative healthcare are offered by Aloshikha. Many children of micro-credit group members are attending Aloshikha pre-schools.

G. PRIMA program.

A large numbers of people were presence during opening hour of PRIMA, where people were very much eager and welcomed to Aloshikha for their positive rolls. These PRIMA buildings will be used for multipurpose works after hand over to the community people and before Aloshikha will execute school cum satellite clinical program 2010 total 37 PRIMAs were established in our activities areas.

J. Special training for TBAs and Village doctors

In 2006 Aloshikha Foundation donated a grant for TBAs and village doctors training, which is being implemented by Aloshikha. It's a meticulous program because after receiving the training, trainees are trained to handle the patients with good care and easily they could find the risk factors. As consequences people are getting good health care and on the other hand pregnant women can be get medical assistance during deliveries period.

The Traditional Birth Attended (TBA) training is playing a crucial role to ensure safe home delivery at rural village. We felt that most of the pregnant mothers in rural villages are not more experienced or much aware about safe home delivery system. In most cases they are depended on untrained or unskilled birth attended as a result child mortality rate is increasing significantly in the area. In order to the organization has lunched a TBA training to ensuring the safe home delivery of new borne babies and to reducing child mortality rate in the area. One TBA Kit Box has been provided every TBA Mother who is successfully passed the training course. The program were supported and financed by the Max Foundation the Netherlands.

Since 16 years ago Aloshikha was demonstrated to the community people for poultry farm business and it was very neglected business to the community people at that time with manifold problems such as bad smile from poultry faces, soft meat and only water inside an egg. So, Aloshikha has been achieved stupendous success through motivation and represented to the community people as model that it is a one kind of profitable business. Today there are many small poultry farms are being established surroundings areas behold with attention as model of Aloshikha poultry farm. It is really indeed, that community people have recognized as a pioneer of Aloshikha on poultry business. In 2010 the profits of the poultry farm were increasing, although the marketing situation for broiler were very difficult, because of low meatprices.

I. Maria Mother & Child Health Care Clinic program of Aloshikha

This hospital grant was obtained from the Government of Japan in 1997 for building and purchase and no administrative costs were included in this grant. Still we are working our activities since 14 years and all medical accessories using properly. We are proud and thanked to them for this grant

We are proud and thanked to the Chairman (Mr. Har Beurskens) of Aloshikha Foundation in the Netherlands who has accomplished and disposed innumerable activities for the hospital of Aloshikha since long and still his vigilant eye for whole activities of Aloshikha with soft hearted.

A semi-pucca hospital named "Maria Mother & Child Health Care Clinic was constructed near the Aloshikha head office at Rajihar Union in 1997. In this hospital some advanced medical equipment was installed to serve the people in the working areas of Aloshikha. This working areas is situated in a low lying and ill-communicated areas where nearest health facilities as named government Thana Health Complex (THC) with limited medical services. Areas people are mostly depend on quack doctors, who are not as well trained as registered doctors and sever scarcity of the registered doctors.

The above circumstances were the main reasons for Aloshikha to start a small hospital with advanced medical equipments and especial attention is given to the health condition of women and children.

This hospital started its services in January 1997 and although it is expected that eventually the hospital will be self-sustaining in the long run but it is impossible to be self-sustaining right from the start. Aloshikha hopes to reach this start of self-sustainability in shortest possible times.

Maria Mother & Child Health Care Clinic services though the trained health providers are as follows:

- a) In door/Out door 24 hours along emergency management
- b) Major/minor operation facilities
- c) Ante-natal, neo-natal and post-natal along incubation facilities
- d) Diagnostics facilities such as Ultrasound, Diathermia, incubator, ECG, X-ray, Blood, urine, stool, sputum etc.
- e) Resistance fund facility for the poor
- f) Patients referral (Ambulance) and out call facilities
- g) Family planning, safe motherhood, breastfeeding, HIV and hygiene counseling
- h) Audio/ Video health conciseness program for out/in door patients
- i) Especial session on collaboration with the Bangladesh government such as EPT, NID, sterilization etc.

The Bangladesh is one of the largest densely populated countries as to its geographical area. In that sense over population is another social issue that we faced everyday. In the view of point the organization has started family planning program including reproductive health and sexual rights of young adults in their target respective area. The main objective of the project was to controlled population by providing family planning method and raising mass awareness on the issue among the community. The organization has affiliated from the Ministry of Health and Family Planning Bangladesh Government on August 3-2009. The program has possible to achieve a stupendous success on the field levels family planning activities in collaboration with Bangladesh government family planning departments. Over the year it had possible to provided permanent birth control system through tubectomy for 51 women and vasectomy for male 5 and IUD for women-8 and implant provided to the 16 women that was merely praiseworthy task for the organization

Mechanical trade

Electrical trade is one of the most important rather than other trade. Electricity is an engine for all kind of development in the country and our social daily life. Its use is dynamic and never we imagine any development is possible to without the electricity in present world. In this context over the year all of our students who are deeply involved in electrical trade and eventually they have skilled and expertise on both the theoretical and practical work. It is crucial that presently they have able to engaged themselves on electrical warring, motor repairing, Air conditioner and refrezator repairing etc. As a result they able to create self-employment opportunity in job market both the national and international levels.



Welding trade

The tailoring and dress making trade is very popular and needful income generating activities among the unemployed youth both the girls and boys. However, presently we have students in the tailoring and dress making trade most of them are girls and unemployed and coming from local poor community. It is evident that Bangladesh is well known all over the world in its export of garments products and earning major portion of foreign currency every year through exports various item of garments products. In one year long course of dress making technology most of the students were gathered much experienced and they able to making pant, shirts, school dress of children, frock, blouse, petticoat, slower and kamize fotua etc. Moreover now they can be able to income money by applying such technology as local levels or town or mega city levels.

It was a one-year long course on mechanical trade where students were learned about both the theoretical and practical lesson. In the practical class every students have an opportunity to gathered much knowledge and make them to expert on drilling work, off hand grinding, sheet metal work, fitting work, operating system of different machine etc. In a word they will be become a second class general mechanic for which they have a lot of scope of work on the sectors in any where around the country or international labor market as overseas levels.



Electrical trade

The welding trade is a very hard and complex technology and has ample demands both the national level and international labor market. In the rapid developing of science and technology in the current world the under water welding technology is high demanded factors in international labor market. However, all of students of welding trade courses have much experienced and experts on how to be 4-G-Arc, Gas welding, Gas cutting and how to be operate terming taper foaming etc. Obviously, they have a glorious opportunity to provide themselves any where in it works either nationally or internationally.
