

Introduction

The Aloshikha RSD Center is now just acting as windows on applied knowledge and provides links to source of information. It is working harder exclusively in rural areas; the greater numbers are involved in water and sanitation, vocational training and education, hospital for primary health care services, closely followed by environment and forestry, fisheries and micro credits, providing small loans. In recent years, the donor has initiated several development projects addressing issues of coastal zone management and targeting programs to enhance livelihoods of the coastal population and trying out to empowering vulnerable rural poor women groups with economically empowered by transferring asset and shops for alternative income generation and self-employment.

Empowering the rural poor is a prerequisite for sustainable development and exercise of their rights. It requires challenging exclusion, discrimination and exploitation of and against the landless, women, indigenous people and other dispossessed. The Aloshikha RSD Center Bangladesh is a professionally managed not for profit making charity based social development organization, registered with the social welfare ministry, NGO Affaires Bureau, micro credit regulatory and also affiliated by the ministry of health and family planning department in Bangladesh. The Aloshikha is committed to address various social and economic problems of the economically depressed and vulnerable groups in general. Empowerment of communities is a central focus issue of all Aloshikha's development initiatives. Over the years, the organization has extended its geographical, beneficiary and programmatic coverage quite significantly. The long term development program now includes education both non formal and vocational training education, micro finance, poultry and fishery and water supply and sanitation. All this work is aimed at supporting disadvantaged poor people. Over the year we have to face many difficulties and challenges with political unrest and natural disaster as well as financial constraints.

By the late 1995 an integrated comprehensive program superseded its sectoral work, focused on concentrated group organization of the poor, emphasizing social, education and economic elements. Since the Aloshikha successes have included the community based health and sanitation program to improving living standards of the out- reach and remote villages are raising awareness of women rights and women empowerment, promoting savings, credit and skill training to improve the livelihoods of the poor communities. The Aloshikha program continues to evolve and innovate; current realities mean the program now comprises a range of various projects and financing large and small, which all contribute to a common objective. However, we are always encouraging to the local communities to developing all form of education in general or vocational education that could be make them smart and expertise to engaged any job or self-employments.

This report is a testimony to the fact that with a synergetic approach towards development with support from the donor community and the local people a lot can be done to improve livelihoods.

Aloshikha Mission statement:

Aloshikha is a Bangladeshi non-profitable humanitarian non-government organization supporting the holistic development of poor and landless people in the rural marshlands between Gopalgonj, Madaripur and Barisal.

Aloshikha will support the development in the following ways:

- To create awareness on the importance of child and blow education among local people.
- To create awareness on health, sanitation, women development issues and community problems To organize targeted poor people in small groups and make them skilled through education, training's workshops and meetings etc.
- To encourage and motivate poor people to take steps to reduce their problems, improve their health conditions and their income.
- To encourage and support the poor people to start their own activities in order to create their own income, so that they will become self- sustained.
- To provide among children and their development through nutrition coverage, child health education, nutritious food, creativity materials etc.
- To provide the safe water supply for hygienic health through the DTWs and distribution sanitary latrine to the community people as sanitation coverage.
- To encourage and convinced to the community people to provide renewable energy as solar system technology for alternative electricity.
- To create employment opportunity and job replacement among the local unemployed youth both the girls and boys and to export skill work force to the international labor market a vocational training center has launched in the Aloshikha complex.
 - Among local people and to encourage them to change the present situation.
- Migrants workers in the area of pre-departure, post- arrival and reintegration assistance of migrants specially to the Middle east countries. The program aims to establishing of pre-departure services and assistance to destination countries and upon in return.

Women Empowerment:

The situation of women in Bangladesh is still insecurity, socially excluded and economically dependent to men.. Many women believe in equality, equal rights, freedom from violence, free of choice and full participation in all areas of society, political and work, But those are just more than a dream. The Aloshi-kha is really realized this consequences and agreed to actively promote women rights. Aloshikha has taken several activities for the vulnerable women to be economically sustain. The activities for the poor rural women are included: women legal rights, gender equality at family and community level: eliminating domestic violence, reducing sexual harassment and rape: offering reproductive health provision, stop trafficking of women and girls and migrant women, early marriages and dowries. Aloshikha is operating awareness raising, advocacy, campaigns and livelihood improving projects to carried out across the spectrum stakeholders and beneficiaries.

Promotion of Self Migration and Rights:

The program particularly focused on promotion of self migration and rights of Bangladeshi rural migrants workers in the area of pre-departure, post- arrival and reintegration assistance of migrants specially to the Middle east countries. The program aims to establishing of pre-departure services and assistance to destination countries and upon in return. The underpinning activities are included awareness rising on safe migration and prevention of undocumented migration/risk of trafficking, reintegration and advocacy in general. The main objective of this program is to promoting supportive environment for migrant workers and their families at all stages of migration with regards to respect for the rights and dignity.


He is very pleased to find the training resources and facilities for the learners. and promised to work together. He was also stayed at Aloshikha guest house.

Orphan is maintaining by Aloshikah own funding programme at the present. But Aloshikha is trying to get fund and support from various donor or individual private peoples.

They are providing support and assistance since 2014 to establish women empowerment center.

Deer conservation program

Md. Safiqul Islam, Inspector and Research Officer Department of Wildlife Animal Conservator, GoB have exclusively visited Aloshikha; September- 2015, particularly for Deer Conservation Program. He issued a Farm category license after close scrutiny and necessary desk work. Aloshikha got an individual catagory license in previous to rearing upto 10 deers only, according to the rules of license.

At present, aloshikha has 22 deer with heavily protection around the wire net boundary and have an excellent proper scientific management with treatment and care.



A. Case Study of Mitu Roy



I am Mitu Roy and age about 15 years. My parent name Surendro Nath and Sreete Ray, address; Village, Nowapara, Union: Bakal, Agoiljhar, Barisal. We are three sisters and one brother. My eldest sister keya Ray is studying; Nursing at Rajshahi Mission Hospital, Mili ray (elder sister) is also studying nursing at Faridpur Mela nursing institute and younger brother name is Shohag Ray. I am studying in class ten (having passed class nine and got admission in ten) at Aloshikha vocational training institute. My parent's economic condition is very measureable and struggling to continue my education due to financial inconsistency. I have completed a short course on fashion and garments from Aloshikha. My dad bought a swing machine for me and preparing trouser, dress and other garments of the local villagers and neighbors. This training has created earning opportunity and sustainable income TK: 1500 /month. This little income is greatly helping her parent to cover daily family expenses. Now I am dreaming my future life to be a fashion designer.

C. Integrated Rural Health Support Programme

The Aloshikha RSD Center is always prioritizing the child health care and nutrition's deficiency. To eliminate the child immorality and male nutrition, ALOSHIKHA has taken initiative and log run scheme called "Integrated Rural Health Support Programme" for the remote villagers to build-up awareness, process to take nutritional food using the local vegetable and food resources. This IRHSP underpinning programme is funded SAKO Foundation (The Netherlands) to strengthening the capacity of outreach works, Health Motivators to mobilize the vulnerable villagers . Aloshikha is operating the IRHSP programme under the following activities:

- 1. Organizing Nutrition Camp through the field visits and health motivators engagement.
- 2. Providing nutrition supplements.
- 3. Organizing advocacy and awareness session on male nutrition

D. Pre-school program

1. Aloshikha is operating pre- primary school under a programme called "PRIMA" over different part of Rajihar, Barisal, Madaripur and Gopalgonj district since last 16 years. Aloshikha has established 41 pre-primary schools and enrolled more than 1230 students. 98 % of students are successfully completed final examination and achieved literacy programme to get admission into formal primary schools. PRIMA school is operating with 30 students age about 5-6 and course duration of two years only. During the learning period children are being better informed about their rights and abusing of child labor and trafficking and related issues. Pupils are getting free medical check-up, quality sanitation and hygiene facilities and nutritional school feeding options (4 time foods for each student). This programme is running by SK Foundation (The

Mrs. AnsS Beek one of senior expert and volunteer from PUM the Netherlands visited Aloshikha and exclusively providing supporte to creativity program of the preschool programme for cognitive development of the children.

Mr. Arun Vatachargoy, education co-ordinator has utilized the creative materials properly and monitoring 41 pre school and 03 Kindergarten school. He is accelerating the ALOSHIKHA creativity programme.

F. Education program (Kindergarten school):

Aloshikha beliefs that education is important for all and without education none can take part to the Nation building process. Kindergarten school education is greatly contributing to achieve quality education for children. The Kindergarten education system is bit costly rather than formal primary education in rural context. The Aloshikha has set-up one kindergarten school in its campus and getting very popular in the locality. Aloshikha has expended the kindergarten schooling programme over Barisal District and set-up three kindergarten schools in different places. The main focus of the program is to ensure quality education with creativity activities on regular basis for pupils cognitive development. Aloshikha is also organizing consultation sessions with parent to discuss about pupils learning progress, home task, challenges, school service feedback etc. issues in quarterly. Most of the Kindergarten schools are mainly academic oriented and we are different and putting little emphasis on extra curriculum activities among the students to learn awareness and raise voice against the child abuse and child trafficking and their rights, road safety and to promoting cultural heritage.

H. Micro-credit program

Aloshikha Micro-credit program is an ongoing programme for poor and marginalized villagers. Aloshikha is allocating micro loan facilities to low income villagers over Barisal Districts specially in remote villages of Agailjhara, Wazirpur, Kalkini, Kotalipara, Rajoyer and sadar Gopalgonj since 1995. The micro-credit fund is disbursing to poor and low income villagers through group savings account modality to engage the money into productive assets development to improve income generating activities (poultry and animal husbandry rearing, home-estate gardening, on firming agricultural production, crop cultivation and shop operation).

Aloshikha is conducting training program for beneficiaries and supervising office staff and management team to utilizing the funding for betterment of the poor villagers.

The integrated approach of Aloshikha micro-credit programme is creating new opportunities to engaging poor villagers, beneficiaries into new micro business; i.e. crop sharing cultivation, off farming business, auto rickshaw pulling, operating micro shops at village corner etc.,

Aloshikha micro credit programme is greatly contributing to improve of livelihoods especially vulnerable poor women for sustainable credit savings.

Aloshikha Fishing Program

The fishing is playing an important role to cover irreplaceable animal protein for poor rural households. The study addressed that the dietary contribution of fish contains vitamin A, calcium and iron intakes and the potential of integrating small indigenous fishes. Aloshikha has undertaken income generating programme through fish cultivationin its own 07 water bodies (ponds) both the high varieties and local indigenous species. Aloshikha has earned BDT: 4,62,500 In the year 2015 through fishing programme; it is a big portion of amount of Aloshikha income.

J. Poultry and Dairy Program:





Aloshikha has inspired the community people for poultry farm business in 18 years ago. But most of the community peoples were considering as a neglected business due to manifold problems such as bad smile from poultry Aloshikha has achieved stupendous success through motivation and represented to the community people as model that it is a one kind of profitable business. Today there are many small poultry farms are being established surroundings areas with attention as model of Aloshikha poultry farm. Aloshikha is operating poultry programme since 1986 by by rearing high breed layer, boiler and hens. It's also contribute nutrition deficiencies of the poorest peoples.

The Aloshikha has started its cow rearing program through Dairy Farm concept since 2005 and initially grassing for 8 cows, in view of ensuring pure milk production and sustainable supply to the local community at low cost.

Aloshikha is providing health care services to marginalized and ultra poor men, women and children since 1997. ALOSHIKHA has awarded a grant from the Japanese Government in late 1997 to build the 10 bedded multistoried hospital building (infrastructure) and purchase of materials to provide health care services. Aloshikha has established hospital clinic called "Maria Mother & Child Health Care Clinic and providing the following health care services:-

Maria Mother & Child Health Care Clinic services though the trained health providers as follows:

- a. In door/Out door 24 hours along emergency management
- b. Major/minor operation facilities
- c. Ante-natal, neo-natal and post-natal along incubation facilities
- d. Diagnostics facilities such as Ultrasound, Diathermia, incubator, ECG, X-ray, Blood, urine, stool, sputum etc.
- e. Patients referral (Ambulance) and out call facilities
- f. Family planning, safe motherhood, breastfeeding, HIV and hygiene counseling
- g. Audio/ Video health conciseness program for out/in door patients
- h. Especial session on collaboration with the Bangladesh government such as EPT, NID, sterilization etc.

M. Aloshikha Solar home system Program



The Aloshikha has promoted renewable energy program as such as solar home panel system due to constant load shedding from the government electric supply sectors. In terms of some off grid areas we also provided solar home system where electric supply chain is inadequate and difficult to connect electricity from the government or non government electric supply authorities, partly because of their insufficient materials and man power and limited power generation. After a study of feasibility the organization intend to establish some solar irrigation pump to ensure food security in the rural field level with joint discussion on farmers group. It is estimated that under the solar irrigation program cultivatable all land should be come in to three cropping system in a year. In order to how number of solar home panels we prodided to the rural community that are given below on table contents:
